Millions of Shorebirds will be Safeguarded with Launch of Groundbreaking Midcontinent Strategic Framework

June 10 marks the official launch of the **Strategic Framework of the Midcontinent Shorebird Conservation Initiative (MSCI)**, a groundbreaking effort to protect the millions of shorebirds that depend on the wetlands, grasslands, and coastlines spanning the central regions of North and South America.

Developed through a multi-year, collaborative process involving over 250 organizations, institutions and agencies, the MSCI Strategic Framework addresses urgent threats to shorebirds, such as habitat conversion due to incompatible practices and climate change across the entire Midcontinent migratory corridor. The MSCI Strategic Framework outlines shared goals and conservation strategies that reflect the priorities of diverse partners, from Indigenous communities and landowners to scientists, conservationists, and policymakers.

"Shorebirds connect us beyond borders and conserving them and their habitats means preserving nature benefits for communities across vast landscapes, such as clean water, healthy soils and our collective ability to face climate change" said [Benoit Laliberté], [Conservation Biologist, Canadian Wildlife Service].
